CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS

The City Council meets on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall Annex (old City Hall), 10301 Market Street. Agendas for the meetings are posted at City Hall, City Hall Annex, and on the City website on the Monday afternoon preceding the meeting.

MEET YOUR CITY EMPLOYEES

Come to the Town Center on Saturday Nov. 14th and meet your City Manager, Department Heads, Inspectors and other great folks that work hard to serve you. Come by from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. to have a cup of coffee and bring your questions, concerns or problems. We know that many of our residents cannot come to City Hall during normal business hours so we want to make ourselves available on your day off.

BUILDING PERMITS ARE THE LAW

Jacinto City requires building permits before you begin a building or remodel project. This includes roofs, driveways, fences, electrical and plumbing work. Permit applications can be found under the "Forms" tab on our website and City Hall's friendly bilingual staff can answer your permit related questions.

ANIMAL CONTROL RULES

All pets must be vaccinated for rabies and licensed with the city. DOGS MUST WEAR THE CITY LICENSE TAG AT ALL TIMES. Dogs must also be secured at all times. Any loose dogs will be impounded by the city in order to keep the city safe. If your dog is missing, call 713-453-7411 to inquire if it has been impounded.

DEBIT & CREDIT CARDS

The city now accepts debit & credit cards at city hall & court. There is a small convenience fee for this service.

ONLINE PAYMENTS

Jacinto City now accepts online court payments and in the near future we will also offer online water bill payments. Once available, just visit the city website for a link to make your payment. Of course you are still welcome to drop by city hall to make payments as well.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

In an effort to maintain a high quality of life in our city and to protect owner's property values, our city has stepped up our comprehensive code enforcement program. Our primary efforts are aimed at correcting unhealthy and unsightly conditions within the city. This includes abandoned or junked vehicles, appliances, debris and other materials left in yards within the city. TRASH SERVICE

Trash pick-up days are Wednesdays and Saturdays of each week, with Saturdays being the heavy trash pick-up day. Limbs and trimmings must be cut into lengths of no more than three feet and tied in bundles weighing no more than thirty-five pounds. Trash may not be placed street-side more than 24 hours before pick-up and all emptied receptacles must be removed from street-side within 24 hours of pick-up. No building materials, tires, or hazardous waste will be picked-up.

PROPERTY TAXES

Within a few weeks property owners will receive combined tax statements from Harris County. Your Jacinto City taxes are listed on that statement and must be paid to Harris County. The Mayor and City Council are very proud to announce that this year's property tax rate is slightly lower than last year's.

POLICE OFFER VACATION WATCH

If you are going to be away from home for more than three days, contact the Police Department to arrange for a vacation watch for your home. This free service consists of police patrols paying special attention to your home while you are gone, including a daily check of the premises by a police officer to be sure all doors and windows are secured and that everything is all right. If there are any problems, you will be notified.

CHRISTMAS PARADE - DEC. 5TH

This year's Christmas Parade will take place on Saturday, Dec. 5th, starting at 3:00 p.m. The parade

ends at Town Center, where there will be caroling and refreshments, and the ceremonial lighting of the City Christmas Tree.

SANTA ON THE FIRE TRUCK – DEC. 12TH

Santa Claus, riding atop a fire truck, will circulate throughout Jacinto City on Saturday, Dec. 12th, beginning at 8:00 a.m. Santa and his helpers will be distributing bags of candy to children.

PUMPKINFEST

The Parks & Recreation Department is hosting its annual Pumpkinfest Celebration at the ballpark located on Mercury Dr. at Challenger 7, Saturday, Oct. 24th.
