1. Call to Order: at 6:00pm

 Mayor and Council to open bids and consider awarding contracts for Debris Management and Debris Monitoring.

City Manager Squyres explained that we need the removal of our debris pile from both storms, the windstorm and Hurricane Beryl. Only two BIDS were turned in and were opened at Council Meeting by City Manager Squyres.

BID: Metric Consulting: Asking to do Disaster Debris Monitoring.

BID: DRC: Asking to do Disaster Debris Management.

City Manger Squyres suggested to postpone awarding contracts until the next council meeting to have time to consult with the city attorney, TDEM, the State and FEMA on the Federal Side.

b. Council to consider the approval of a sole source contract with Accurate Meter & Supply for the installation of a smart water meter system using ARPA funding.

City Manager Squyres explained that this is Federal Funding, it's ARPA Grant Money which dates back to the days of COVID and one of the things we could with this is install smart meters, this is one of their approved projects and it's something that Jacinto City has been wanting to do. A Smart Water Meter System will be installed throughout the city from one end to the other. All components need to be compatible with each other for the system to function. Our consultants told us we need to use sole source contracting on this rather than going open-bid because it will not do us any good to go open-bid on water meter systems if they're not compatible. So there's only one system that can do this. In order to make sure we are legal, the City Attorney, Jim, has reviewed it, as far as the process, Grant Works, whom we hired to make sure we are in Federal compliance to lay out the process, says were good, down to the wording of the agenda item has been approved by them and so we are good, all we have to do is evaluate this. The bulk of the expenses are the meter themselves, the average meter is a 5/8 inch \$575 dollar meter, we did ask for a couple minor changes; we wanted them to delineate one hundred of those because if there is someone who frequently doesn't pay their water bill, we want to put a different meter; an automatic gated meter that we can turn off or on from city hall. It would not be completely off but would slow it down to a trickle. Item 30 on page 10 has the extra; so for every one of those extra we add to it, in other words if we have extra money because we're not using as many meter boxes as we thought, we can install for senior citizens as well, to assist during freezes. This proposal is from the only company in the region that can do this work and be compatible with us and everything has already been preapproved by legal, the grant management company and by our engineering company which is who put this together. It's called a sole source bid process. A short question and answer dialogue ensued between the Council Members and the City Manager.
