5. Reports/Announcements of City Departments:

City: City Manager Lon Squyres

As you all know, Council approved us applying for 3 different GLO Grants they are called DRRP Grants, each one is 2.2 million in total, so a little over 6 million. We were told tentatively; it looks like we're definitely going to get two of them and they are trying to find a way to award the third one to us as well. The third one is the lane street replacement line which is the main sewer line exiting the residential area going across the bayou over to the sewer plant of course and that's a pretty needed project obviously. There are some issues as far as demonstrating a benefit to what groups of citizens and what incomes of citizens, its very technical but GLO feels very certain that we'll meet the criteria, its just going to be a few more hoops that we've got to jump through but the paperwork on these things is just unbelievable but it looks like in all likelihood we are going to probably receive all three of those grants. So, we'll advise you when that happens.

7. New Business:

a. Mayor & Council to Open and take possible Action on Received Sealed Bids for construction of the Northwest Waterline Rehab, Phase 4 of 4.

-Synopsis given by City manager Lon Squyres.

This is a water line that is funded by one of the earmark grants, it's going to run along Market Street and some connections underneath the railroad which are extremely expensive to provide but it gives us interconnects between the various parts of the city and that's really important to have redundant water supply. We only have one bidder on this, two showed up for the mandatory Pre-Bid the other day and this is SCOHIL Construction out of Cypress, TX and they do have their bid bond and their bid form. The Base Bid is \$1,453,269.00 and the Total Bid is \$1,578,269.00. They Both are high for what we were expecting, it came in a little bit higher than what the engineer said to estimate it. This is the first grant that the city has ever had directly with HUD which is how congress decided to manage this grant, and by the way this is a 2022 awarded grant, and HUD just put a lot of paperwork out there for us to get to this point. So what we do now is we will go, if council approves this, it'll be pending HUD approval as well, and then we will negotiate with HUD and see if they'll allow us to trim and take some things here and take some things there and bring it down to an amount that HUD will pay for or see if HUD will supplement the funding for it or they may well say well can the city supplement the funding and our answer to that usually is an automatic no but we'll come back to the council for that decision of course. The recommendation to Council would be to approve it to SCOHIL pending approval of the engineering service, Grant Works and of course HUD, the funding.

Councilman Robinson asked: "How close to the Independent Estimate was it?"

City Manager Squyres replied: "The Grant itself is just over a million, the Independent Estimate from the Engineer came in, I think, at one million, one hundred and eleven".

Councilmember Robinson asked: "The other contractor didn't say why they didn't want to bid?"

City Manager Squyres replied: "No, their due date was today, they gave us all indications that both would've bid on the project."
