5. Reports/Announcements of City Departments:

City: City Manager Lon Squyres

- Gave Kuddos to one of our Police Officers. We received a letter from the DA's Office, it says ADA, Peter
 Basilious and Saradimus held a trial for an aggravated sexual assault of a child case, securing a guilty
 verdict and a 40-year sentence. It was Detective Cynthia Nieto with JCPD, she worked the case; It was in
 2023. We were able to put this person away where they should never be able to hurt another child. So
 kudos to officer Nieto and to the DA's Office.

Public Works: Thomas Rogers

- Update on the Wastewater Treatment Plant, they are pouring the concrete for the new measurement basin next week. The new contractors are making a lot of progress.

- We're still cutting grass three times a week as weather permits.
- All the meters have been installed for the Water Meters Project. They are wrapping up on a handful of boxes that we requested, they go back and change out.

b. Council to Hold Record Vote on Proposed 2025-2026 Tax Rate.

Synopsis provided by City Manager Squyres:

The tax rate being proposed for this year is identical to the tax rate of last year. For every \$100, that tax rate is just over sixty cents. It's actually \$0.603444. So per \$100, identical to last year. Now, there's a few other numbers that we need to make you aware of. The county calculates in a 14-page worksheet, some information. One of the numbers they calculate is what they called "no new revenue tax rate". It used to be called the effective tax rate. That rate is 0.589981. So that's a no new revenue tax rate. If we didn't want to take in another dime more than we took in last year in total taxes, that would be a tax rate. And since we don't have bond debt, it's the same for our M&O, which is Maintenance and Operations, and if we include our taxes. For bonds, because we don't have any bonds. So you're not paying any bond debt where you to spend another 10 cents for bonds, you're not burdened with that because we get so many grants now. We can, by law, you've heard the county fight a lot about, wanting to go and vote for more taxes. Well, that's because if you go above 3.5% of your no new tax rate, you have to go out and vote for it. You've got to ask your citizens to prove it. So we can go all the way up to 0.611033 without asking for a vote. So, again, 0.611033 with no vote. But yet, we're only asking for 603 So there's like eight cents, 7.58 cents. We could be asking for without going to the voters. But we would rather save the citizens that money and work at a current budget level. And then we could also use something called the Deminimus Rate, a.k.a. Fire Truck Law. When they voted for this in the legislature, they said, "Well, what if a small city needs to buy a fire truck?" They said, "Well, okay, if your city's under \$30,000,

you can raise your taxes to do that kind of thing by X. And it's enough to make \$500,000 in taxes. That was back in the day where you could buy a fire truck for \$500,000. Chief Davis will tell you those days are long gone. We're not asking for the deminimus rate either, That's a lot more. It's 0.656062. So we're being very reasonable on this. We're asking for identical rate of last year, which is about seven and a half cents lower than what we could without going to the voters for a vote. So a little more information, we're supposed to remind everybody that the proposed budget will raise when we do the budgeting a revenue from property taxes a little more than last year by about \$150,000. Now, a lot of that is because of new things on the tax of development and things like that, it's 3.48% more than last year, but it's not within that 35 because it's new development. The property tax revenue to be raised from a new property added to the tax rolls in new property is \$53,662.03. Then last but not least, and this is going to be in that same thing you're going to end up seeing in the paper, we're supposed to tell you what your taxes would be. So the medium valued home by the census in Jacinto City is roughly \$121,100. Your current tax bill last year was \$730.77. on that home that you're Jacinto City taxes, not school district, not county or anything else. Last year's will be the same as his coming year, if this is approved, because there's no tax rate. It's the identical rate. The property tax, if we would have gone, the no new revenue rate would have been \$715.26, about \$15 less.
